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Equity Framework: OFCY Investments in Children, Youth and Families

- OFCY's strategy areas focus funding to address the needs of Black and Latinx youth and families.
- OFCY will specifically prioritize funding for proposals that center the needs of Black/African American youth and families who face the greatest disparities.

Equity Framework: OFCY Investments in Children, Youth and Families

- Funding prioritizes specific communities of color, including Pacific Islanders and Native Americans.
- Priority for direct services to communities in East, Central, and West Oakland.

Equity Framework: OFCY Investments in Children, Youth and Families

Funding prioritizes specific vulnerable groups including:

- Opportunity Youth
- Youth involved in Foster Care
- Children and Youth Experiencing Homelessness
- Newcomer and Immigrant Children, Youth, and Their Families
- LGBTQ+ Children and Youth
- Children and Youth with Disabilities
- Commercially-Sexually Exploited Children and Youth (CSEC).

The RFP supports three types of applicants:

Single Agency Applicants

One agency applying for OFCY funding. Receives the majority of funds requested through the application and provide the majority of direct services. Can use subcontractors and consultants.

Collaborative Applicants


Three or more agencies working together. All three agencies receiving funding and provide direct services. No agency receives more than 60% of total funds.

Small & Emerging Applicants

Focuses on both smaller organizations and on new emerging agencies with annual organizational budgets under \$500,000. Agencies must have completed at least one year of programming related to services by the time they apply to OFCY.

OFCY encourages very small community initiatives to apply using a **Fiscal Sponsor** if they do not have 501c3 status or the fiscal and administrative capacity to manage the contract.

The Request for Proposals (RFP) process will lead to new grant programs starting next fiscal year, and will take place over the next six to seven months.



OFCY is aiming to release the RFP in early January 2022



OFCY operates an open and fair application process, providing transparency with the public regarding the grant selection process. The RFP for 2022-2025 will clarify the steps in the selection process and how the POC will incorporate the Equity Framework in funding recommendations.

The application consists of five sections that will be reviewed scored:



In addition, applicants will need to complete and upload the following documents for the application:

- Required City Schedules (E, I, O, W)
- Agency Financial Documents
- Annual Budget
- Board of Directors
- IRS 501c3 letter
- Letters of Agreement with Key Partners


