










Average Days of Attendance per Student (comprehensive afterschool)





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Average Hours of Attendance by Race/Ethnicity (children and youth only)



OFCY Impact

80% (1,456) of Career Awareness and Employment Support participants worked in an internship or job placement during their program.

78% of High School and Postsecondary Success participants agreed that their program helps them feel more confident going to college.

- Some groups were more likely to report positive outcomes in all areas of youth development:
 - Youth in high school or out of school
 - Black children and youth
- LGBTQ+ youth were less likely to report progress toward improved self-confidence and self-esteem than their peers.

Conclusion (page 28)

- Pandemic-related challenges persisted.
- Programs continued to demonstrated creativity and adaptability.
- On average, programs served 127% of the youth they projected serving.
- Programs continued to offer more individualized services, including wellness checks and connections to resources.

How Well Did They Do It?

"When I'm feeling sad or angry, I usually don't know what to do. I end up ignoring my feelings... 


