Our comprehensive programs provide academic & social supports to ensure students graduate high school eligible to attend a 4-year college, provide extracurricular opportunities and support our students through the college application process. We support our alumni to ensure their graduation.





#### PROGRAM DESCRIPTION:

Youth Radio's Pathways to Higher Education program integrates educational support for high school completion and college preparation for students in low-performing schools who are most affected by the achievement gap. Our program includes intensive individualized academic support, test preparation, and support for college and postsecondary matriculation and acclimation. This approach has led to extraordinary results: in 2012, 96% of Youth Radio's students successfully graduated from high school and 87% of graduating seniors matriculated into post-secondary institutions.



The seven-year program includes two phases: an intensive college preparation and academic success program for high school students and a college program that provides scholarships and ongoing case management to ensure persistence.









OUSD's Peer Restorative Justice Program (PRJP) recruits and trains approximately 120 student leaders (11-14 years old) in 8 middle schools. Youth reflect school diversity, and once trained, co-facilitate up to a total of 288 mediation/RJ circles per quarter to resolve conflict and repair harm. They also use RJ practices to implement community-building circles and for re-integration of students into the school. PRJP aims to reduce violence and disciplinary referrals, and to support the academic achievement of all students by helping to create a safe school environment.




