<b>Positive Engagement:</b> Percent of youth who respond that they are interested in the program	<b>87%</b>
<b>Supportive environment:</b> Percent of parents who say staff make them feel comfortable and supported	<b>93%</b>
<b>Diversity and inclusion:</b> Percent of parents who say staff work well with families of different backgrounds	<b>79%</b>

<b>Youth Leadership:</b> Percent of youth who view themselves more as a leader	<b>70%</b>
<b>Community Connectedness:</b> Percent of youth who feel more connected to their community	<b>79%</b>
<b>Career Goals:</b> Percent of youth who learned about jobs they can have in the future	<b>90%</b>
<b>Employment Skills:</b> Percent of youth who learned what is expected in work setting	<b>92%</b>
<b>Interpersonal Skills:</b> Percent of youth who feel they know how to get along with others in a work setting	<b>86%</b>
<b>Knowledge of development:</b> Percent of parents who say the program helped them identify their child's needs	<b>67%</b>
<b>Skills to manage behavior:</b> Percent of parents/caregivers who say the program helped them to respond effectively when their child is upset	<b>67%</b>
<b>Connection to resources:</b> Percent of parents/caregivers who report that staff refer them to other organizations	<b>67%</b>
