The Hub will provide onsite resources and services to support children’s healthy development and kinder-readiness so they will succeed and thrive in school and life. Services include child care and family services navigation, curriculum-based parent-child playgroups, a Parent University, family engagement, PreK activities and a parent leadership group. We envision the Hub supporting 620 children birth to 5 and 1,835 caregivers.












Race/Ethnicity





Age (as of first day of grant)





