Agency Name: The Youth Employment Partnership, Inc.

Program: Healthy Wealthy Wise

Annual Grant Funding: \$225,000

Program Summary: The Healthy, Wealthy & Wise program is a trauma-informed, culturally relevant, Cognitive Behavior Therapy (CBT) curriculum focusing on system-involved youth and young adults. The program will serve 75 justice-involved or justice-impacted youth over one year within 16 week cohorts. Participants will be separated into school-age and young adult cohorts.

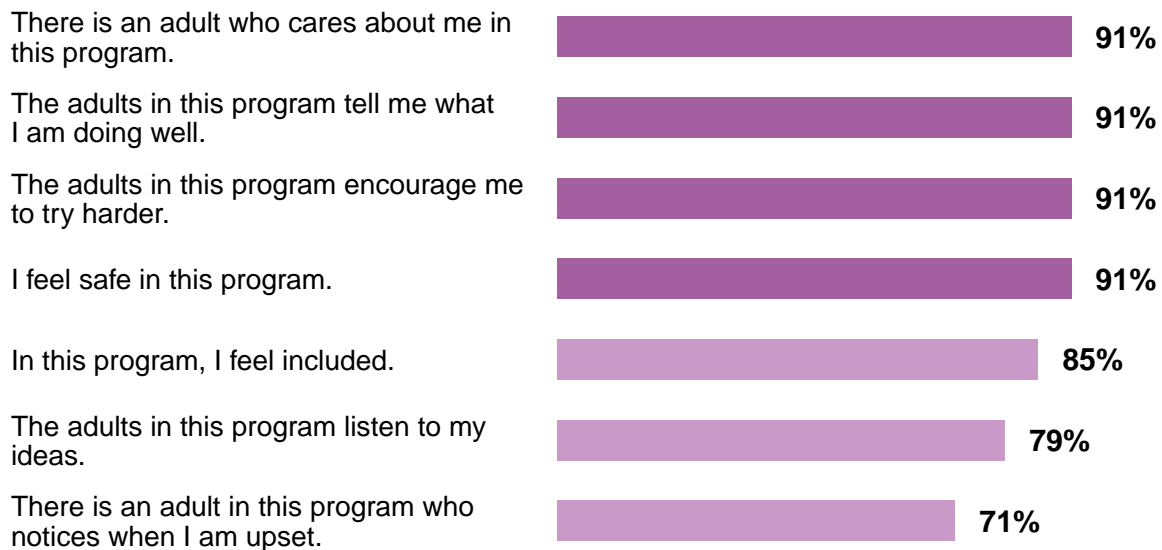

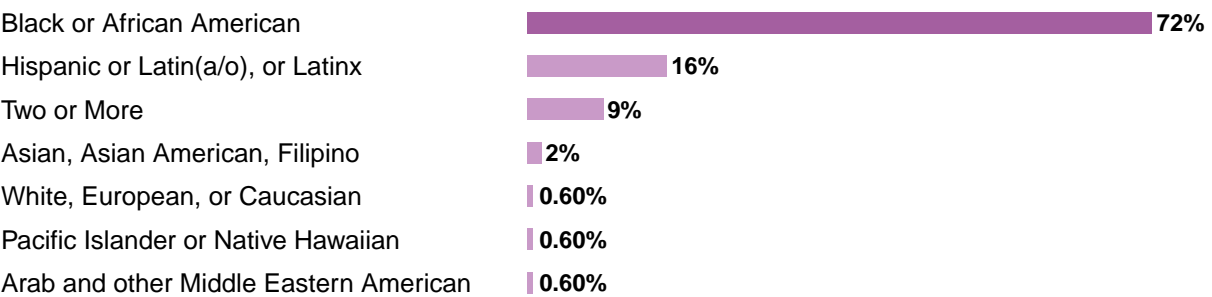

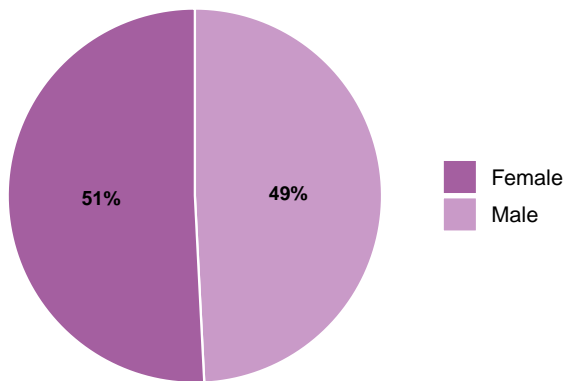

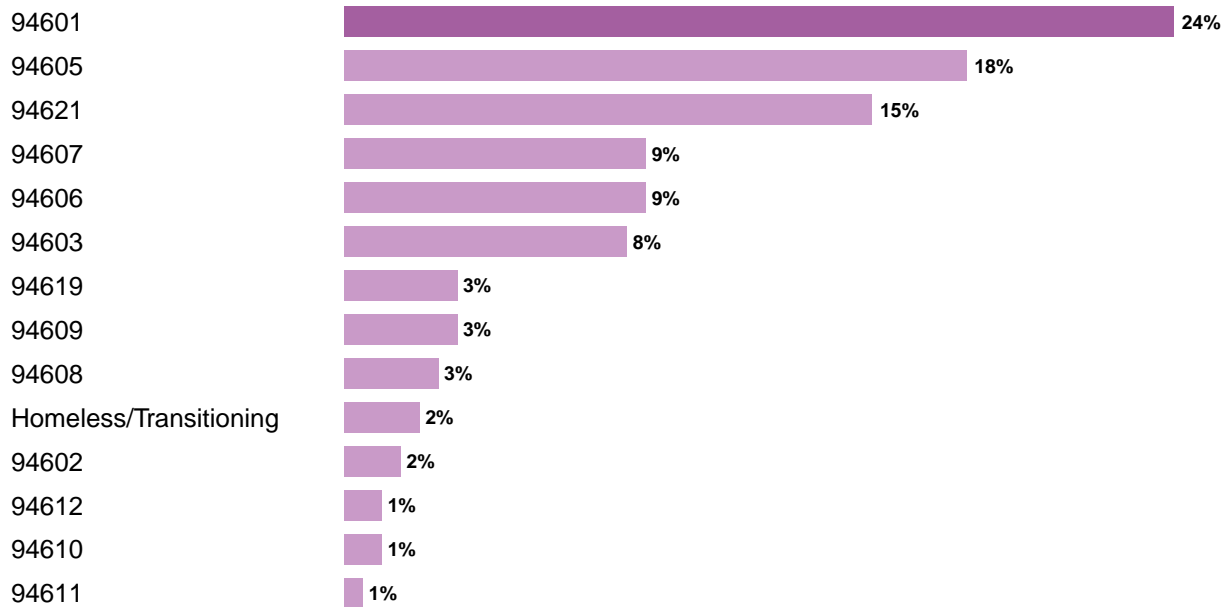
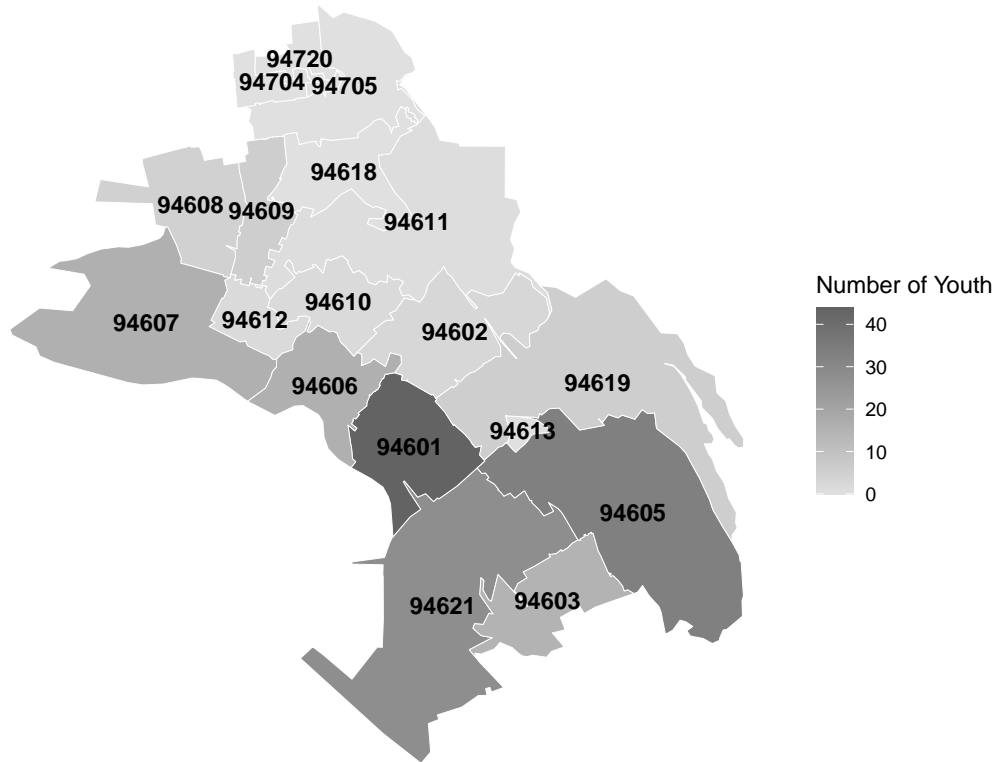

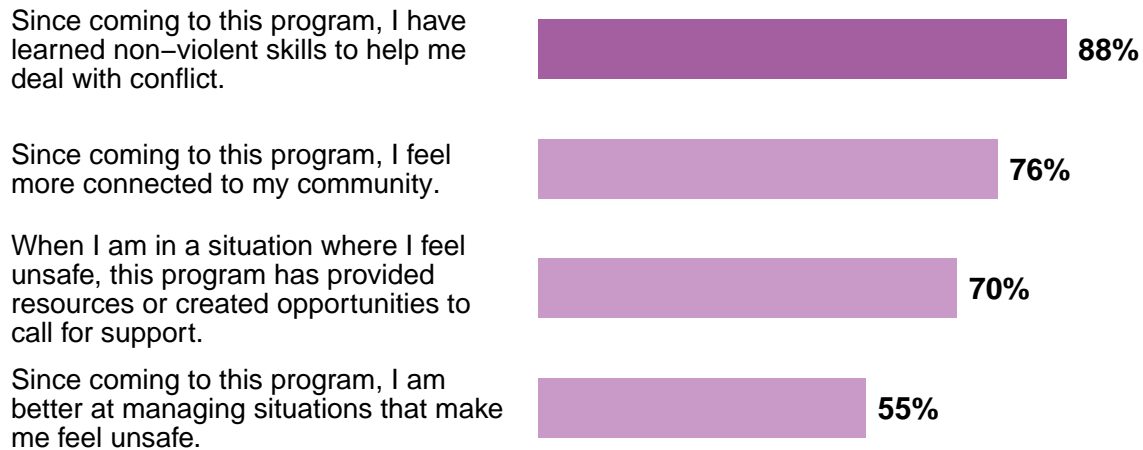

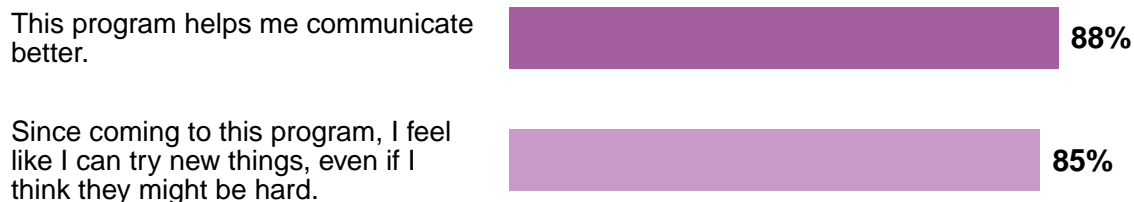

Agency Name: The Mentoring Center

Program: TMC's Transformative Youth Violence Prevention Program

Annual Grant Funding: \$190,000

Program Summary: The Mentoring Center will provide violence prevention, positive youth development and leadership development programming on a weekly basis to youth and young adults, ages 14 - 21 through Transformative Mentoring, life coaching and leadership development, through a trauma-informed, healing focused, culturally-grounded approach. The youth we serve primarily will be West Oakland residents but will include youth from all over Oakland, who have been exposed to or impacted by violence and who are involved or at risk of being involved in the juvenile or criminal legal systems.

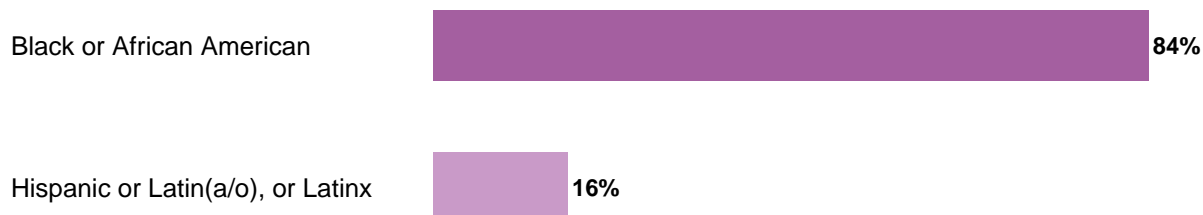

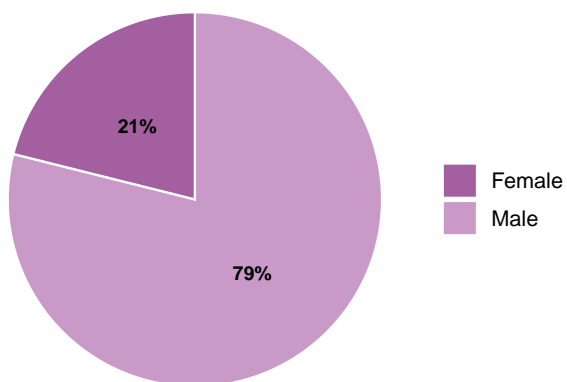

Race/Ethnicity (N = 19)



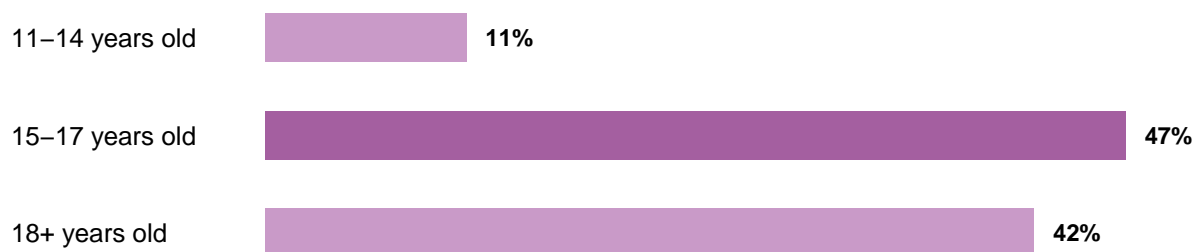

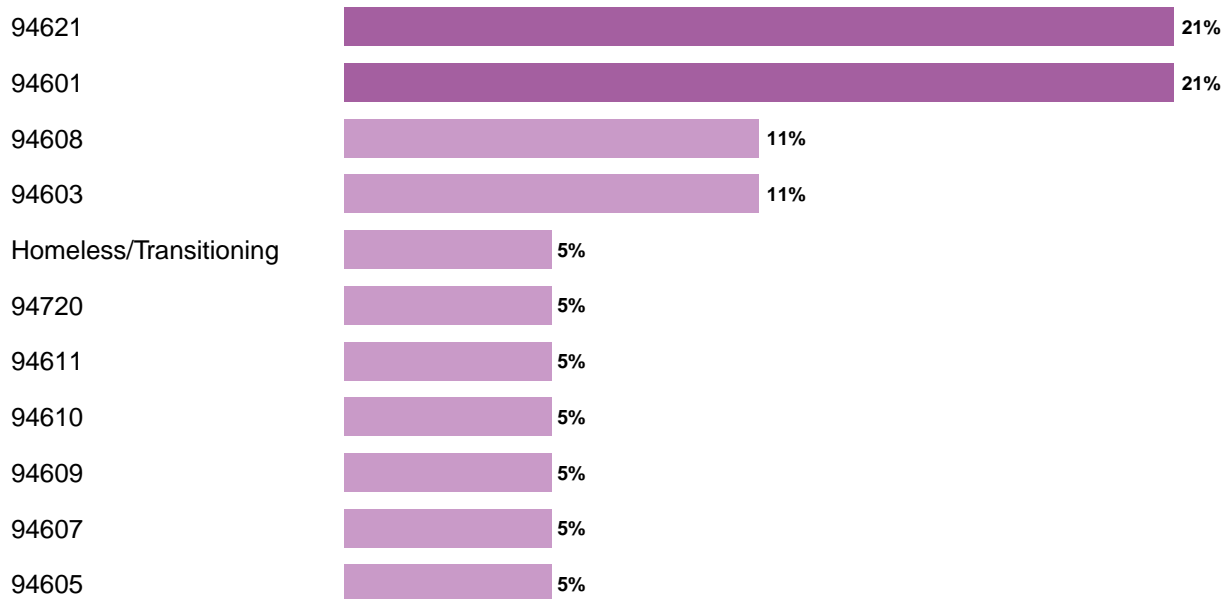
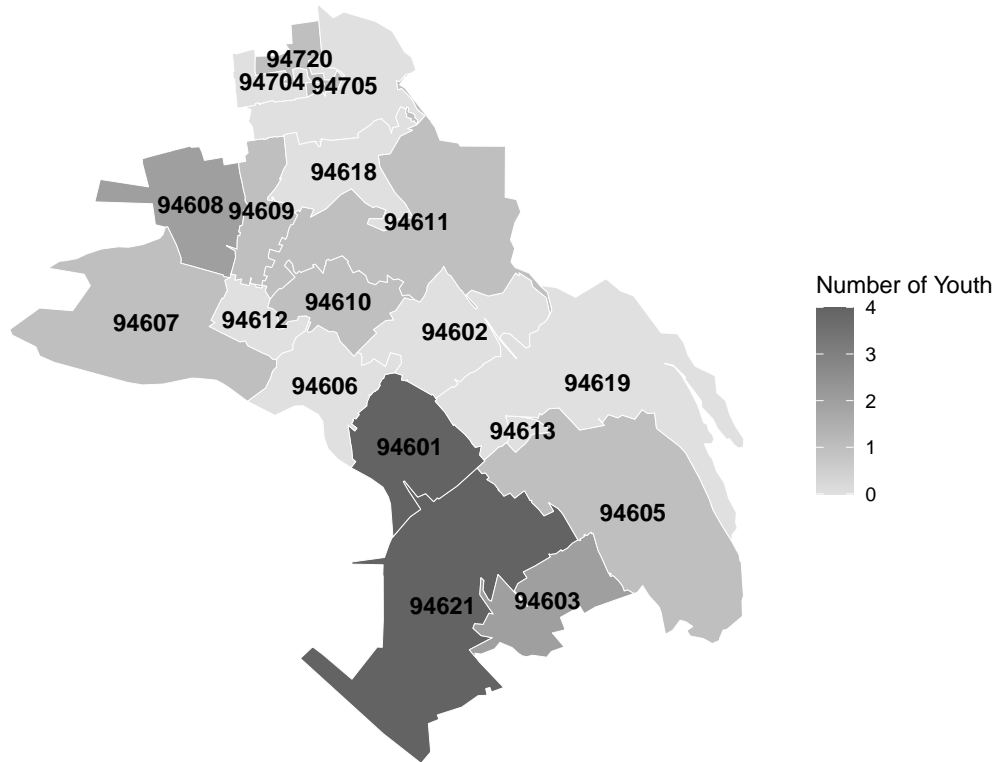

Agency Name: Youth ALIVE!
Program: Teens on Target
Annual Grant Funding: \$240,000

Program Summary: Teens on Target (TNT) will train 79 students at Oakland’s Castle-mont (27), Fremont (25) and Skyline (27) High Schools to be violence prevention peer educators and civic leaders, in 2-3 weekly after-school sessions and a 4-week summer program. TNT youth leaders will teach 100 violence prevention workshops to 270 students in OUSD classrooms, engage in 48 meetings and public events to advocate for peace, and earn stipends. TNT staff will provide 1752 hours of 1:1 adult mentoring. New violence prevention knowledge and skills will transform young Oaklanders. At least 70% will mediate a conflict.

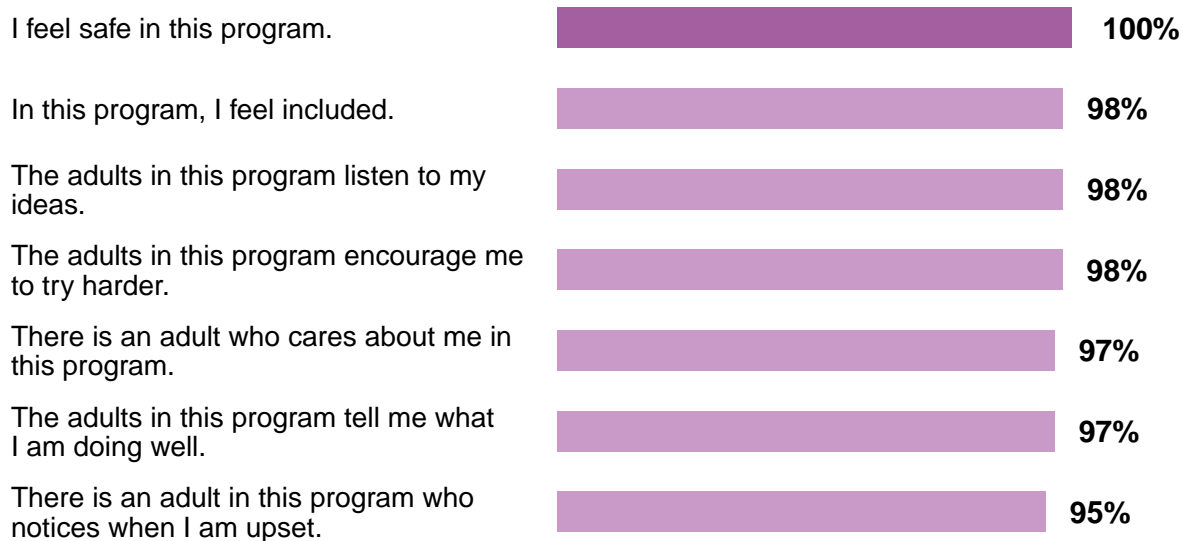

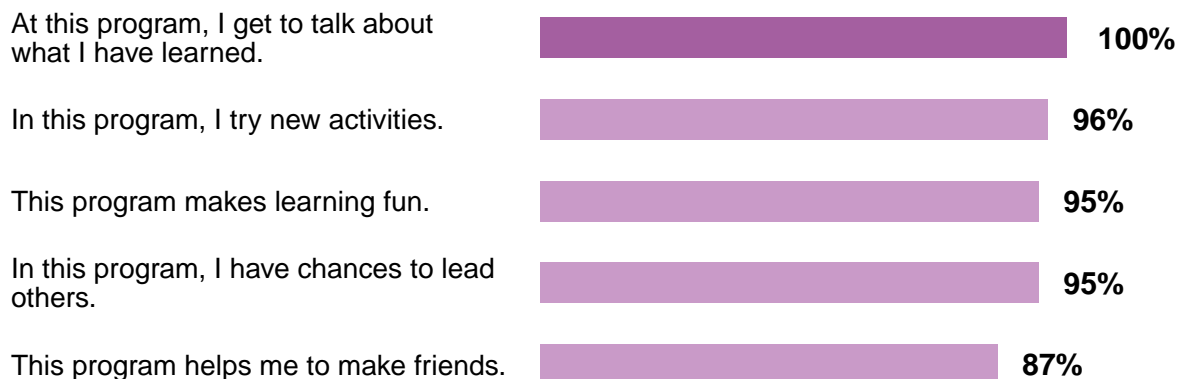

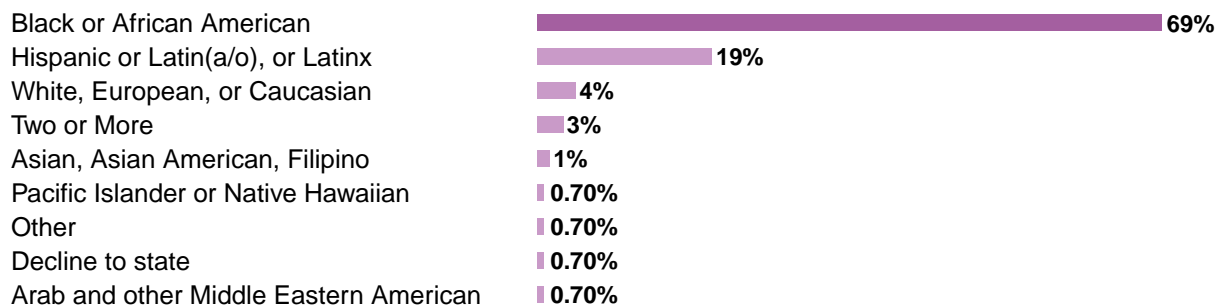

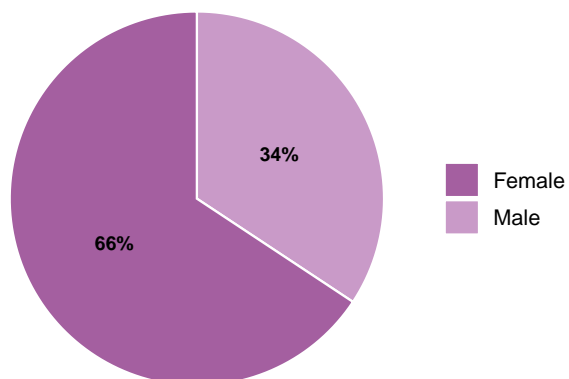

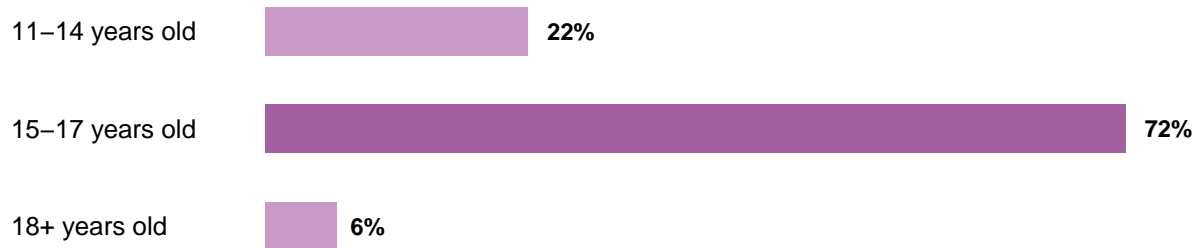

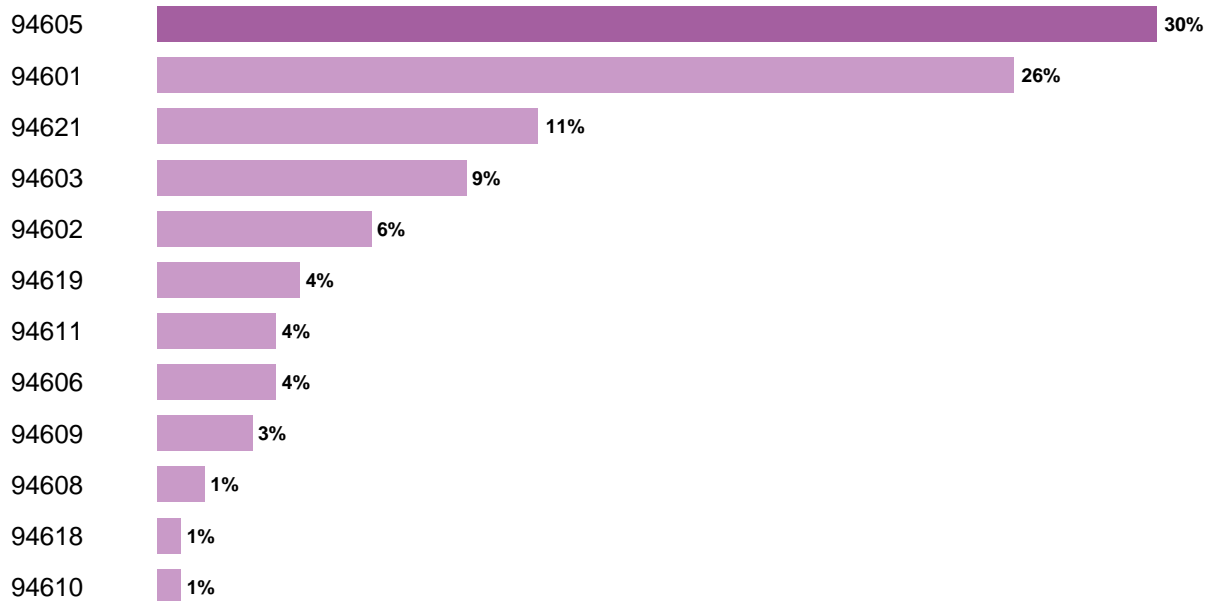
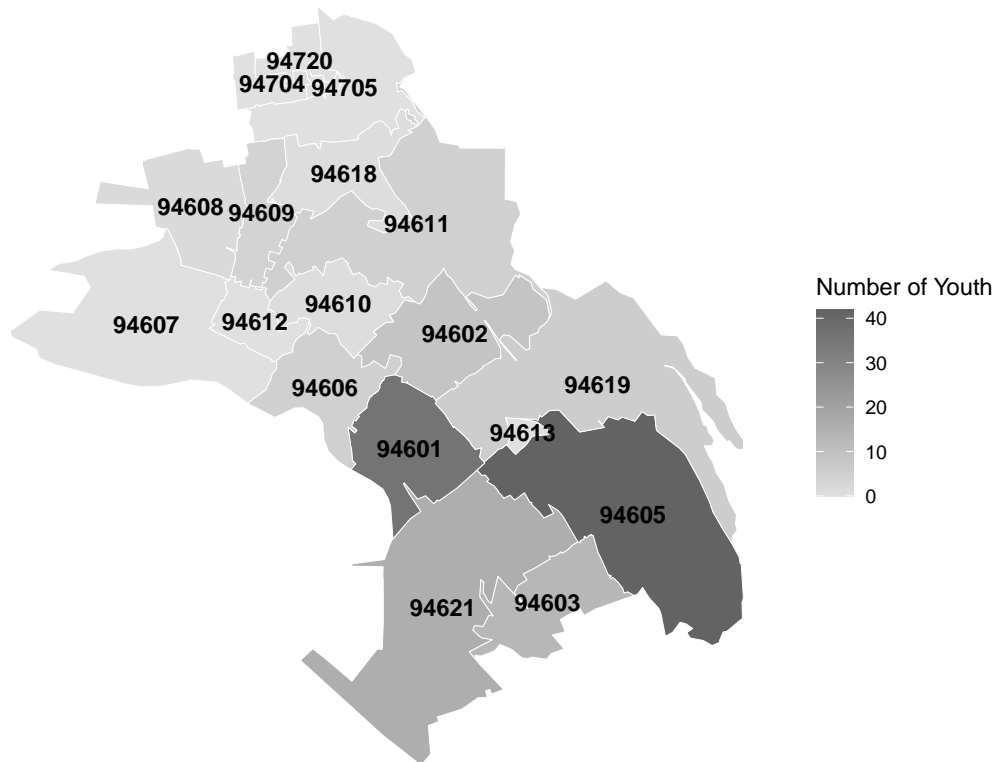

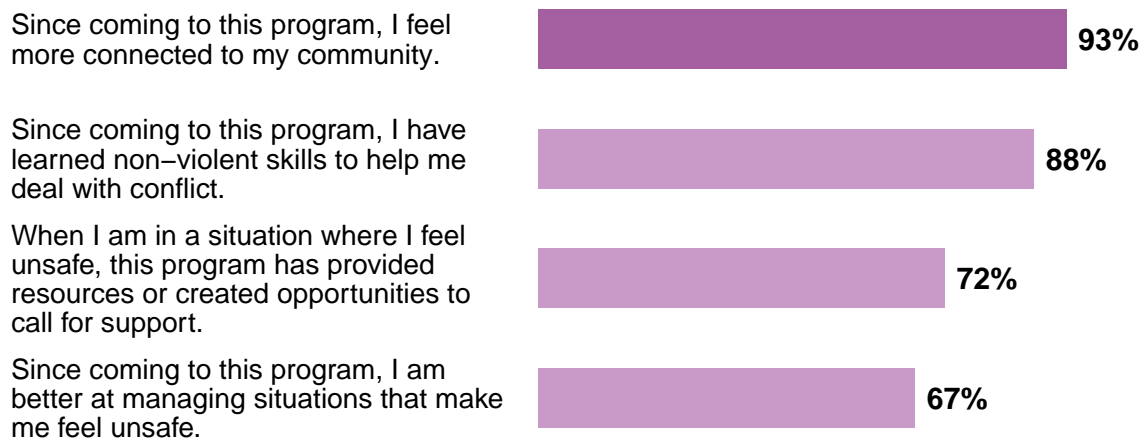

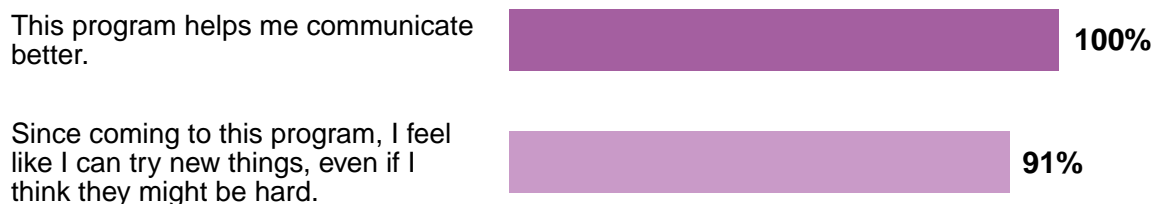
